# Standing Firm

"Take up the full armor of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm" Ephesians 6:13

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# O Happy Day!

Do you remember the day you were baptized? That day stands out in my memory very clearly. I remember my entire immediate family had come to worship services that day, because my intentions were announced the night before. I remember my father crying as I came forward to obey the gospel. I remember the congregation singing. But more than anything else, I remember the feelings I had after being baptized.

I felt clean. Not physically clean, but spiritually. I felt the burden of all my sins disappear. There was a sense of wonderment and sense of innocence I don't think I've ever felt again. It was not a feeling of the Spirit of God causing my to speak in tongues, or a feeling that I had been given some special revelation from God; rather, I believe I was experiencing the feelings that every Christian from every time has felt just after being baptized. Acts 22:16 says it this way, my sins had been "washed away". Through the blood of Jesus we are able to stand before God as a pure, clean, believer. We seem to forget these feelings after awhile. Our thoughts return to the day-to-day grind of living life with its temptations. We gain consolation by the fact that the cleansing blood of Jesus does not stop when we come out of the watery grave of baptism, but instead continues throughout our life. "If we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). John says that after we have obeyed the gospel and are walking in the light, the blood of Christ cleanses us. He did not say it cleansed us, but that it keeps on cleansing us. The point is made very clear in 1 John 1:9 where it says of God: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." So the feelings we had after coming our of the water CAN be our again, each and every time we repent, confessing our sin" We can feel clean again!


After being baptized, I felt joy! There was great rejoicing in my heart because I knew my sins had been forgiven, and that I was in fellowship with God. The only time a Christian can ever feel that kind of joy again is by returning to fellowship with God.

It is a joy much greater than anything this earthly life can offer, for God is the source of the joy! His willingness to extend salvation to men, should result in our joy when we take advantage of it. In the same way, we should be able to recapture that joy whenever we feel the need to seek God's forgiveness. 1 John 1:9 says "He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins", which should bring great joy to the life of the one who is forgiven!

My enthusiasm for the Lord and my zeal for His cause has never been higher than it was 30 seconds after my baptism. I wanted to tell the whole world about Jesus and what He did for me! I wanted everyone to hear what God offers them! Somehow the zeal fades over the years, but it can be regained. Each time we study a passage of Scripture that talks of the love of God, or the particulars of the plan of salvation, we should imbibe deeply of the things said so that we might more fully comprehend and appreciate what God has done for us. As we continually bring these thoughts into our mind, we cannot help bit have a zeal for serving God and telling others. When we look through the bubble of our existence and see all of those living around us in sin, we should desire all the more to tell them of Jesus and the saving power of His blood.
