

Going To The Erring Brother

It seems it's always at night. Somehow night makes the trip more somber, more official. Most of the time nowadays you can't just drop by, you have to make an appointment. What will I say? Will the words come out as I intend? Will I remember the Scriptures I looked up? What will the reaction be? Surprising, isn't it, how many random thoughts go through your head in the short time it takes to drive over.

Here is a fellow Christian. The appearance is that something is very wrong in his life, something that stands out as amiss when compared to what the Scriptures would have Christians be and do, a missing of the mark, sin. And now someone needs to care, to take interest, and that someone is you and me.

Before you go, pray. Pray for your attitude and theirs. Pray for wisdom. Consider your own state before God and seek His forgiveness as needed. Can you really expect to influence someone to do what you neglect to do yourself (James 1:5; 5:16)?

When you arrive, be patient, listen, understand the facts (James 1:19). Together, look up the Scriptures that apply. It should come as no surprise that the erring brother in most cases knows what's going on is wrong and can likely identify the Scriptures as well as you can. If this is true, restoring a fellow Christian may take more than pointing to the words and expecting all to be well and the job done.

What results are we hoping for? Is it to change behavior? Surely it is, but is that enough? When you consider the Scripture (Gal. 6:1) consider this: if it is the spiritual who are to restore those in trespass, should it not be the ultimate goal to make that brother equally spiritual? Motivation to endure faithfully needs attention, encouragement and understanding. Whatever the sin may be, there can be no better beginning than to look again at the love of God for us, the terrible price willingly paid that our sins might be forgiven and the debt of love and gratitude we owe for that sacrifice. "We love Him, because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

Some will not return to faithfulness. While there may be
many strong external influences that account for this, there is
one observation we should carefully consider. The longer a sin is
practiced and the sinner ignored, the more the sin becomes habit
and the sinner is hardened. Each of us should become close to
all in the congregation, but it is nevertheless true that there will
always be those we spend more time with either by circumstance or
choice. As we work together, shop together, play together, shouldn't
somewhere in our conversation be God and His word, faithful
living, our weaknesses and our faults brought up? Shouldn't good
friends pray together besides over a meal? And, shouldn't they be
the ones best equipped to help us stay on the path that leads to
